OVERVIEW OF THE PROGRAM

2003 - 2009

The “Euro-American Colloquia on Citizenship” was instituted in 2003 to help overcome the “transatlantic divide” between Europe and the United States.

The foundation organized a program to promote the exchange of knowledge and information on the experience and state of the two citizenships, by involving scholars and actors from the public arena (political, institutional, private, social and civic).

The choice of the theme “citizenship” comes from the desire to focus the debate and discussion on the differences and similarities of one of the key elements of American and European identity.

As of today, FONDACA has conducted 6 editions of the program, in partnership with Italian and American universities, public institutions and other organizations. Overall, 29 events have been organized, 14 in Europe and 15 in United States involving some 150 experts from different fields.
