Assistant Professor of Political Science

The Department of Political Science at Wayne State University in Detroit, Michigan, seeks applicants for a tenure track position in at the level of Assistant Professor for scholars with expertise in non-profit organizations, either domestic or international. The department is interested in candidates with a research and teaching specialization in some facet of non-profit organizations, but is open with regard to substantive focus.

Candidates must be prepared to teach a graduate-level course in non-profit management in addition to other courses in the department's graduate and undergraduate curricula. The position includes responsibility for the supervision and administration of a Graduate Certificate Program in Nonprofit Management at the University Center in Macomb. The teaching load is 2/1 over two semesters to reflect the administrative responsibilities.

The department offers B.A. in political science, a B.S. in public affairs, a NASPAA-accredited MPA, an MA in political science and Ph.D. concentrations in Public Administration, Public Policy, Urban Politics, Comparative Politics, World Politics, American Government and Politics, and Political Theory. The starting date is August, 2011. Applicants should submit a letter of interest, curriculum vitae, statement of research interests, evidence of teaching effectiveness, and arrange to have at least three letters of reference sent to: Search Committee, Department of Political Science, 2040 Faculty/Administration Building, Wayne State University, Detroit, MI 48202. Review of applications will begin on November 15 and continue until the position is filled. The position is subject to budgetary approval.
