

CHAired FACULTY POSITION MANAGING FOR SUSTAINABILITY

The School of Management at Bucknell University seeks a suitable candidate to fill the Howard I. Scott Chair in Management, available to a full-time, tenure-track faculty member with a strong background in sustainability and at least three years of experience in teaching and research following the Ph.D. Applicants should be prepared to teach courses in sustainability as well as in related fields such as organizational behavior, strategy, business and society, or marketing. The successful candidate will provide evidence of developing and maintaining a meaningful program of scholarship that includes a focus on sustainability. The chair has a rotating five-year term with eligibility for renewal depending upon teaching and scholarly performance.

Bucknell University embraces the teacher-scholar ideal; therefore, applicants should be dedicated to excellence in teaching and scholarship and should desire to make an intellectual contribution in both arenas. In keeping with Bucknell's liberal arts tradition, the school supports both traditional scholarship and creative scholarship that transcends traditional disciplinary boundaries. The standard teaching load for this position is five course sections per academic year. We seek candidates who want to work in a collaborative interdisciplinary environment, develop innovative learning experiences, support our students through the mentoring/advising process, and serve the university community.

Established records of excellence in both scholarship and undergraduate teaching are required. Full-time organizational or managerial experience is highly desirable. Qualified applicants will have completed the Ph.D. degree or equivalent. The preferred rank for this position will be at the full or associate professor level, but senior assistant professors will also be considered. A successful candidate who has not yet attained tenure at another institution may be given credit toward tenure; one who has already attained tenure at another institution will either be given credit toward tenure or hired with tenure, depending upon his/her particular portfolio.

APPLICATION

To complete the application process, visit our on-line application system at www.bucknell.edu/jobs. Complete applicant files must include a letter of application, a current vita (including the names and contact information of three references), evidence of teaching effectiveness, a description of your scholarly plan/research agenda, and a statement of teaching philosophy. In addition, short-list candidates (those candidates in consideration for an on-campus visit) must submit samples of your scholarship and arrange for three letters of reference to be submitted. Please do not submit scholarship samples and letters of reference unless and until asked to do so by the Search Committee Chair. Only formal applications received via Bucknell's online system (www.bucknell.edu/jobs) will be accepted. Applications will be reviewed beginning June 15, 2010 until the position is filled. Search committee members will conduct first round interviews at the Academy of Management Meetings in early August.
