### Urban Economic Development (Tenure-Track)

We seek a scholar in urban and regional economic development. Candidates should be well versed in a variety of strategies designed to improve economic conditions in urban areas, including, but not limited to workforce development, industrial policy, business incubation, small business assistance, and manufacturing retention. Expertise in economic development policy in the United States is essential; international expertise is also desirable.

### Environmental Policy and Sustainability Management (Tenure-Track)

We seek an expert in Environmental Policy or Sustainability Management, with a focus on one or more of the following policy or management areas: Sustainability Strategy, Environmental and Resource Economics, Environmental Assessment, Urban Environmental Policy. Expertise in either organizational management or a public policy background is desirable. This position is part of a new planned master's degree program with two tracks, environmental policy (public policy and ecological impact) and sustainability ("triple-bottom line") management.

### Non-Profit Management (Tenure-Track)

We are seeking an individual whose focus is in the area of nonprofit (NPM) or non-governmental (NGO) management broadly, but with a particular preference for a candidate whose work is focused on leadership and change, arts and culture, sustainability, and/or advocacy.

Financial Management, Budgeting, Accounting & Finance (Tenure-Track). We seek an expert in the areas of financial management, budgeting, accounting, and finance, with particular attention to applications in the non-profit sector. Understanding connections to both the for-profit sector and the public sector will be important. A solid grounding in performance management, capital markets, social finance, corporate social responsibility, and/or socially responsible business would be a plus. Ph.D strongly preferred although candidates with strong practice-based experience and who have previously taught graduates students may be considered.
