The Department of Public Administration offers a NASPAA-accredited Master of Public Administration (MPA) degree with an emphasis on local government and nonprofit administration. The Department is located within the university's newest college – the College of Community and Public Affairs – and is housed in a beautiful state-of-the-art facility located in downtown Binghamton on an historic site at the confluence of two rivers. Our commitment to engaging in community-based research is evidenced by the work of individual faculty as well as the activities of our affiliate centers – the Center for Applied Community Research and Development (CACRD) and the Center for Local Government (CLG). We welcome applications from individuals with expertise in any area of public administration although the ideal candidate would be able to support the Nonprofit Management and Leadership specialization and would also teach within the MPA core. Practitioner experience in the nonprofit or public sectors is desired, as is a record of teaching effectiveness and active scholarship. Ph.D. preferred; ABD considered. Compensation is competitive; the teaching load is the equivalent of two 4-credit courses per semester.

Binghamton University is not only a comprehensive doctoral research university but has also been rated by the Fiske Guide as the “premier public university in the northeast” and a “best buy.” Binghamton University has a diverse student body, with students from all 50 states and 100 countries; roughly one-third of the 14,500 enrollees are students of color. We seek applications from individuals who can contribute to that effort. Individuals of color are particularly encouraged to apply.
